

What We Do
Matthew 22:35-40

1. **Matthew 22:35-40** tells us that we are to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind; and then we are to love our neighbor as ourselves. In what ways do you fall short of this command to love God with all that you are? To love your neighbor as yourself? What specific changes can you make in your life to fan the flame of your love for God, and others?
2. Jesus said, **“Even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve.”** How does Jesus’ model of servanthood inspire you? What impresses you the most about His willingness to serve others? What are key principles and applications from Jesus’ example that you can use in your personal life and ministry?
3. Pastor Dave shared many various ways we serve the world at The Chapel (Loaves & Fishes, Life Givers, Grief Share, college outreach, Night to Shine, etc....). He also shared two new concrete ways we can help in the coming weeks: with the Afghan refugees and the “12 Mile Bridge.” Spend time in prayer, asking God to show you (as an individual and/or as a small group), where He wants you serving, and how you can help. Commit to serve (as an individual and/or small group) in some way in the year ahead!
4. **Acts 2:42-43** paints a picture of *a family* – spending time together, eating, studying the Word, praying..... and they were filled with awe! How can we be more “devoted” in the days ahead, to God and to each other? End your group time by praying for each other and for The Chapel, as a family of Christ-followers. Pray that we would love God, love people, and serve the world – and do those things well!
