

Introduction:

1. What is the mission statement of Jacksonville Chapel? (*if you need help, see the bottom of this page*)
2. Describe a time when you recall being heartbroken for the world. Was it just a feeling, or did it cause you to act differently? Explain.
3. What are the things that typically headline your personal prayer time? What are some ways we can pray for the Chapel regularly, and the mission that God has given us?

Understanding:

4. Read Matthew 28: 18-20. Why did Jesus lead up to His command with a statement of His authority?
5. What is the relationship between the authority someone gives Christ in his or her life, and to serving Him?
6. What does it mean to be a disciple? What should a disciple “look” like here at the Chapel?
7. Read Matthew 22:36-40. How is loving God related to loving people? How are loving God and loving people related to evangelism?
8. If a measure of your love for God is your love for people by sharing the gospel with them, how great is your love for God?

Application:

Set aside time this week to pray for the vision that Pastor Dave shared today. Here are a few specific areas to remember:

- The work to establish an offsite campus: That God would lead us to the right place, that we would touch many lives with the power of the Gospel, and that many people from the Lincoln Park campus would want to be involved
