### **Look Up: The Book of Psalms**

Royalty-Psalm 72

# Introduction (choose 1):

- 1. What are qualities that are important to you in a leader?
- 2. Do you think that we all have a deep longing for a leader who is strong, and good, and truly worth following? Discuss.

# **Understanding (choose 4-6)**:

- 1. David prays that Solomon will lead with *justice*. Discuss this quality and why it is important to have in a leader.
- 2. Read Hebrews 12:13. What types of people is God most concerned with when it comes to justice?
- 3. David prays that Solomon will lead with *flourishing*. Discuss this quality and why it is important to have in a leader.
- 4. Pastor Dave talked about leaders who are like a refreshing rain. What did he mean by this?
- 5. David prays that Solomon will lead with *dominion*. Discuss this quality and why it is important to have in a leader.
- 6. Read Psalm 72:10-11. What is David's prayer for Solomon in these verses?
- 7. How is Psalm 72 a reminder of the longing for Jesus that God has placed on our hearts?

## Application:

- 8. Has a leader in your life disappointed you? How has that situation affected you? Take time to pray for comfort and wisdom in that area and also to know the leader that will never disappoint- Jesus.
- 9. Take time to pray for the leaders in our lives. Pray for our church leaders, leaders in our towns or places of work, and also for the leaders of our country. Pray that they may show the qualities of leadership we learned about from Psalm 72.

#### **Lectio Divina**

- 1. Opening Prayer: Ask God for insight into His Word, for open hearts and minds, for hunger to know Him better, and for an attitude of learning from one another.
- 2. Reading: Have someone from your group read the passage aloud. It is best to print out a copy for each group member so they can read along, make notes, or go back as needed.
- **3. Meditation**: Spend an <u>entire minute</u> in complete silence, contemplating what was just read. Feel free to re-read the passage quietly to yourself or jot down thoughts/highlight what stuck out to you.
- 4. Sharing: At the leader's signal, invite group members to share their insights for about 5 minutes.
- 5. **Repeat**: After the 5 minutes are over, repeat the process 2 more times using the same passage. Listen/read like you haven't heard this passage before. If there are longer moments of silence, the leader can prompt discussion with the following questions:
  - 1. What did you hear and what seems important?
  - 2. What is the Holy Spirit impressing on you?
  - 3. What does it make you think of from your life?
